

EUROPEAN PRINCIPLES OF INHIBITOR MANAGEMENT

Approximately 30% of people with haemophilia A and 5% with haemophilia B develop inhibitors - currently the biggest complication in haemophilia care. The following 10 principles emphasize the importance and benefits of a centralized and multidisciplinary approach.



Awareness of inhibitors and risk factors **throughout life**.

Early recognition and accurate **diagnosis**.



Access to haemostatic agents.



Inhibitor eradication by **Immune Tolerance Induction (ITI) Therapy**.

Organisation of care and communication between **all stakeholders**.



Access to, and optimal preparation for **surgery** and other invasive procedures.



Tailored physiotherapy care and monitoring.

Regular **dental reviews**.



Specialist nursing care.



Psychosocial support.



Research and innovation.
